

PubMed on Tap Overview

PubMed on Tap is a **research** project of the Communications Engineering Branch of the Lister Hill National Center for Biomedical Communications, National Library of Medicine. PubMed on Tap is an application targeted at mobile health care professionals. The goal of the project is to discover and implement design principles that facilitate focused retrieval of MEDLINE[®] citations from a PDA through a *wireless* connection to the Internet.




Search results tab.




Results in Brief mode.

The PubMed on Tap client program runs on Palm OS devices with a wireless connection to the Internet. The client communicates with our proxy server which in turn communicates with PubMed. Features in the latest version include: email citations to yourself or others, save citations to the Memo Pad, a clustered results option, several search limits, and an improved GUI. We are seeking feedback from volunteer evaluators. If you or your colleagues have Palm PDAs and access to a wireless LAN, please consider evaluating PubMed on Tap for us.




